>>> LAUNCHPAD - CURTIN PS

In Zak's Launchpad course, students tested water rockets to prepare for an experiment where they will explore the best amount of water to launch a rocket to the highest possible altitude. In future lessons students will get the opportunity to launch more water rockets before moving onto solid fuelled model rockets in Term 3.

>>> WILDLIFE WARRIORS

Students in the Wildlife Warrior course have really enjoyed researching all about endangered animals in the world. They looked at the IUCN Red list of Threatened Species, which divides species into nine (9) categories. Using all of the information acquired through their research, students had to compile a report about a chosen endangered animal including many topics relevant to their chosen animal. Students recently enjoyed an incursion from Birds of Prey. This was a 'hands on' session which provides the students with ample time to observe, touch, and engage with a selection of Western Australian birds of prey. The students learnt about their prey characteristics, behaviours and habitats. Needless, to say the students had a fantastic and informative incursion!

>>> PEAC STUDENTS FACE APOCALYPTIC CHALLENGES!

How can you ensure that your clan has the resources, wealth and health to not just "survive", but "thrive", in a post-apocalyptic world?

These were the challenges faced by Year 5/6 PEAC students during an incursion experience led by Andy Kirker, aka "The Games Man". In teams of two, students played their "clan" through a series of challenges, using strategic thinking, collaborative decision making (and luck!) to become the strongest clan of all. This interactive board game pitted teams against each other, but in the end, it was working together that was the key to survival. Think "Dungeons and Dragons" – but with a twist!

The "How to Survive an Apocalypse" PEAC course sees students exploring the challenges that might be faced – and coming up with creative solutions – to survive in a world we don't recognise.

And yes, there are zombies!





Reminders

>>> CYCLE 2 PAYMENTS

Schools have now been invoiced for Cycle 2 course payments. These assist us in ensuring students have enriching opportunities as part of their courses and we thank parents/carers for paying this promptly. This amount is paid to your child's mainstream primary school and then transferred by the school to the PEAC administration.

If you are unsure about course payments, please get in touch so we can assist you with this process.

>>> BYO DEVICES AT PEAC

Students are welcome to bring their own iPad, tablet or laptop to PEAC if they wish to do so. Parents must ensure that devices are insured under your home/private insurance ahead of bringing the device on site, as these are not covered for any damage on the school site. Students must connect to the school wifi (no SIM card/roaming data) and adhere with the ICT expectations on site.

Our staff have been working toward developing some new posters to connect our PEAC Values with expected behaviours, to encourage a positive learning environment, both face to face and online.
